**Ed:** Yes, that's right. I had to walk along a dark, narrow jungle trail. When I reached the village, there were three small houses and one larger building, which was the school.

**Sandra:** I see. So, they had a school building.

**Ed:** Yes, but they had no teacher.

**Sandra:** How big was that village?

**Ed:** Well, there were only three families that lived there. I told them in their own language that I was there to help them and teach the children.

**Sandra:** They must have been happy to hear that. How many children were there?

**Ed:** My first class had seven boys and girls.

**Sandra:** Was it difficult to teach these children?

**Ed:** Not at all. They soon learned to write their names and write numbers. They were enthusiastic and wanted to learn much more.

**Sandra:** Is that right? I heard that you had 70 students by the end of the first school year.

**Ed:** Yes, the school grew. More people came to live there so their children could go to classes.

**Sandra:** Ed, you must have had a very valuable and rewarding experience.

**Ed:** Nothing was more rewarding than to see my students read books out loud with enthusiasm and twinkling eyes.

**Sandra:** Oh, how touching! Well, ladies and gentlemen, I am afraid we have to end this interesting interview with Ed. Ed, thank you for coming.
