**J:** That is great! She's so kind, isn't she?

**T:** She sure is. It really helps because I don't have so much extra money and I know hotels in Tokyo are very expensive.

**J:** They are!

**T:** Anyway, Mayumi's family seems to be a very respectable family. Her father is a tea ceremony instructor and her mother is an interior designer. I don't want to leave a bad impression with them. Could you tell me how I should greet them when I arrive at the house?

**J:** Well, I don't think you should worry too much. Just act naturally. It is true, though, that Japanese people are polite and that they don't speak too casually before they get to know each other well.

**T:** So I should be polite.

**J:** But you don't have to bow too much or anything, just smile and speak gently. You're not going to say "Hi, dad!" and slap him on the shoulder from the start, are you?

**T:** Of course not.

**J:** Then it's OK. Oh, maybe you should call them by their last names, like Mr. Yamaguchi. It's not common in Japan to call people older than you by their first names. If someone younger calls seniors by their first names, it can be taken as an insult.

**T:** Oh, I have to be careful then. Thanks for the information.

**J:** My pleasure. Have a nice trip.
